Buncefield: Is This The End?!



The local residents were hugely affected by an explosion at the Buncefield oil depot (which is in Hemel Hempstead). Early on Sunday morning, a massive explosion was heard and the early air was being polluted with ebonyblack smoke.

It was just a normal Sunday morning when a disastrous catastrophe hit the Bucefield industrial estate , which is on the outskirts of the sleepy , tranquil Hemel Hempstead.
