Space Mission on the International Space Station (TSS).

Un 15th December 2015, at 11.03 am, Tim Peake, Space, and reached ISS (International Space Station) at 5.33 pm. After landing on the ISS, aboard the first British ESA member to go aboard the International Space Station (ISS). Tim Peake Spent 6 months living and working in space. He was also the first ever person to do a space walk. Very impressively, he travelled 50m in space to complete maintenance work, also completing The London Marathon on the treadmill in space. When returning back to Earth, they had to dock manually instead of using the computer this took 2 hours. There appeared via a video link at the Brits award...

On 18th June 2016, Tim Peake, Yuri Malenchenko and Tim kopra launched into space, and reached returned safely to Earth, Tim travelled in the Soyuz Capsule and landed in kazakhstan at 9.15 am.
