Top Tip of the fortnight: At the back of many of the home/school reading books are a picture summary of the story. Young children need to practice their story sequencing skills so a great idea is to get them to retell the story using the picture to cue their memory.

Please don't forget to ask your child to <u>read their book three times</u>. The idea is that they can read a book effortlessly before changing it. When they get to the purple colour book band (or above), it's only necessary that they read it twice. Please don't let them read it once and then change it. Of course, if they really don't like a book then we're happy to change it a couple of times.

Decoding the words is important, **but so is understanding what has been read.** After reading a section try asking your child 2 facts they have found out about the story or the information on the page. Can they use the text to find the answer to a question? Often there are questions to try at the back of our reading books.

2R: We're enjoying reading 'Fantastic Mr Fox' so much that we've even been writing our own stories featuring the different characters from the book. Everyone has come up with some amazing words to use in their writing thanks to the great examples that Roald Dahl used.

Following on from our independent reading the other week, lots of 2R have also moved up a book band showing just how much their reading is coming on. A particular well done to Marni and Ellie who are both making great progress with their reading.
