Greenhouse gas emissions in the UK have fallen for the seventh year in a row. New information from the government shows that greenhouse gases are down because we're using a lot more renewable energy. Greenhouse gases can be harmful to the planet - they are gases in Earth's atmosphere that trap heat. Scientists say many of the changes to the Earth's climate are being directly affected by human activity - this means things that humans are doing, like burning oil, and deforestation. But we've got far more renewable energy sources now - things like wind farms and solar panels. Wind power generated almost a fifth of the UK's electricity in 2019 - a lot of that was down to one of the biggest offshore wind farms in the world, which sits just off the Yorkshire coast.
