- Continued inclusion of Balanceability Learn to Cycle provision for EYFS and KS1, including accredited CPD for Nursery and Year 1 Class Teachers
- Tudor continues its recent success in inter-school sporting competitions with investment into the DSSN and transport
- Continue to subsidise Year 6 skiing lessons so that every pupil is offered the opportunity to learn a less traditional, new sport
- Curricular and Extra-Curricular success contribute to Tudor's first ever Platinum School Games Mark.
