# Sports Lead

## Intent:

Ensure the enhancement of training opportunities/ qualifications of PE deliverers, with particular focus on the Sports Lead's management of sporting provision at Tudor

## Implementation:

- To ensure children access skilled and proficient sports coaching
- Staff to be supported with their own professional development
- Staff to have quality exemplar of PE teaching from a Level 6 qualified subject leader

## Impact:

- PE Subject Leadership continued to be managed at Platinum rated level
- Sports Lead continues to lead the PE delivery of at least one PE session per week in EYFS and UKS2 – children have access to high-level coaching
- Sports Lead has offered bespoke support to ALL class teachers' PE delivery – targeted interventions, session planning, session delivery etc.
- Termly observations of class teacher delivery, with feedback provided in order to improve practices across the school
- 16 sporting and 10 non-sporting afterschool clubs managed across the school
  - 65% of children have attended at least one afterschool club this year
- Wide range of intra-school sporting competition and enrichment opportunities – GB Athlete Visit from Liam Jury and Sam Walker, and Glow in the Dark Dodgeball for example.





## Intent:

To pay for subscription to DSSN, ensuring that children are able to participate in inter-school sporting opportunities

## Implementation:

- Dacorum School Sports Network has provided access to inter-school sporting opportunities.
- School is supported with high quality training/ consultation opportunities.

## Impact:

- Tudor has been represented at 13 different sports competitions across the district
- EVERY child from Year 1 – Year 5 has represented the school in at least one inter-school competition this year
  - This will be followed by EVERY child in Year 6 after their event in July 2026
- Tudor has continued to achieve highly in district competitions
  - Year 1 Multi-Sports Winners
  - Year 3 Target Games Champions
  - Year 5 and 6 Boys Football Tournament District Champions
  - Year 5 and 6 Boys Football League Semi-Finalists
  - KS2 Dacorum Dance Runners Up
- DSSN has continued to share training and enrichment opportunities that Tudor has followed up – Links with Premier Education, the LTA, AfPE Swimming Guidance.



# Balanceability

## Intent:

All EYFS and Year 1 class teachers are qualified and confident to deliver Balanceability scheme, allowing children to learn how to balance on a bike in preparation for future pedal bike riding.

## Implementation:

- Balanceability training organised for EYFS and Year 1 Class Teachers
- Sports Lead to attend higher level "Get Cycling in Schools" programme, sharing course content with Tudor staff

## Impact:

- Further 3 members of staff are now fully qualified to deliver the Balanceability programme
  - This means ALL EYFS and Year 1 staff have fully accredited qualification (and Sports Lead)
- Sports Lead has attended the Get Cycling in Schools programme, whereby our practices were highly commended and used as model examples for other schools
- Upon attendance of GCIS course, Tudor received a further 6 Balanceability bikes and helmets FREE OF CHARGE
  - Tudor now owns 21 Balanceability bikes and helmets
  - New balance bikes are used daily in EYFS play and learn sessions, with feedback stating that balance and coordination skills have increased greatly
- Passion for cycling continues to rise across the whole school, evidenced by the number of children cycling/scooting to school, and attendance at Freewheel Friday sessions
- Balanceability is a fully integrated part of the EYFS and KS1 curriculum



# New Equipment



## Intent:

Investment in new PE and breaktime equipment across the school

## Implementation:

- Children have a range of activities that interest all groups at breaktimes, evident in all seasons
- Children enjoy being active at breaktimes and standards of behaviour remain high
- New PE equipment is ordered that can be used in classrooms to ensure lessons remain of the highest quality

## Impact:

- Breaktimes and lunchtimes remain a hive of activity, with a range of activities on offer on a daily basis
  - Tudor Owls requested for skipping to be available at breaktimes
  - Lunchtimes typically include football, tennis, basketball, as well as other games
- 3 new sports introduced to the school's sports provision, implemented into the PE curriculum and extra-curricular offering:
  - Gaelic Football – pupil voice
  - Scooting – based on Yr6 PGL participation
  - Archery Tag – based on Yr6 PGL participation
- Investment in classroom PE activities so that PE remains high-quality and linked to a range of relevant objectives, in case of poor weather and hall being unavailable; shuffleboard, classroom curling, table tennis.



# Bikes and Trikes

## Intent:

Replacement and upgrade of Scooters, Bicycles and Tricycles on Foundation Stage Playground

## Implementation:

- Sports Coach to liaise with Early Year lead and Class Teachers to source new scooters, bicycles and tricycles
- Sports Coach to maintain bicycles and tricycles regularly to ensure sustainability
- Children have daily usage of new equipment during play and learn
- Children gain initial confidence on bicycles and tricycles prior to Balanceability PE sessions in Reception and Yr1

## Impact:

- 11 new bicycles/tricycles ordered after discussions with EYFS team
  - Awaiting delivery
- 3 bicycles/tricycles have been fully repaired, reconstructed and repainted by Sports Lead, so that EYFS children have a sufficient amount to access daily
- 6 new Balance Bicycles and helmets received after Sports Lead's participation in Get Cycling in Schools Qualification
  - These are accessible to EYFS children every day, and are proving hugely popular
- Participation numbers and cycling ability continues to be raised across the school, with the focus on cycling in EYFS providing an initial start on children's gross motor skills journey at Tudor



# Transport



## Intent:

Transport to be provided to a range of inter-school sports competitions

## Implementation:

- Children able to attend sporting festivals and fixtures.
- More children enjoy opportunity to represent the school and be inspired through sporting activity

## Impact:

- Transport provided to 7 inter-school events
- Year 1, 2, 3, and 6 have all benefited from transport to inter-school competition, allowing EVERY child in these year groups to represent the school
  - (Year 4 competition on site, and Year 5 competition was a walkable distance to off-site venue)
- Tudor walking to as many off-site competitions as possible in order to save money on increasing transport prices (venues such as Adeyfield School, Longdean School, and Jarman Park Athletics Track)



# Skiing



## Intent:

Continue to attend Skiing lessons (at Hemel Hempstead Snow Centre) as part of the PE provision

## Implementation:

- Cost of skiing to be subsidised for each child, in order to offer provision to every pupil in Year 6

## Impact:

- Skiing is continued to be offered as a fully integrated part of Tudor's PE curriculum
- Every pupil in Year 6 is offered skiing lessons at the Hemel Hempstead Snow Centre
- Year 6 pupils attend weekly skiing lessons in June 2026
- Year 6 staff members will be fully aware of every lesson outcome and pupil attainment within each, so this can be used to evidence whole PE pupil assessments
- Costs to parents of skiing lessons is heavily reduced due to part school funding
